In Atlanta, Georgia, HHM planned, coordinated, and facilitated tribal consultations among the DOD agencies, the National Council of State Historic Preservation Officers, and 27 federally recognized American Indian Tribes indigenous to the southeastern United States. The prime reason for meeting was execution of a Regional Comprehensive Agreement among the consulting parties that would streamline all tribal consultations on DOD installations in the Southeast. Issues

addressed included inadvertent discoveries, Traditional Cultural Properties (TCP)/sacred sites, land access, flora/fauna cultivation, integrated cultural resources management plans/integrated natural resources management plans, and management strategies for archeological sites, burials, and TCP/sacred sites. This project shows HHM's ability to plan and facilitate cultural resource-focused meetings between tribes and federal agencies.
