## CULTURAL RESOURCES AND HERITAGE ASSETS SURVEY OF MARINE CORPS RESERVE CENTERS



HHM conducted a survey in 2003 and 2004 of twenty-one geographically-dispersed Marine Corps Reserve Centers to document heritage assets (historic objects) and cultural resources (architectural and archaeological) for the Marine Corps Forces Reserves. HHM researched the history of the buildings and photo-documented all buildings and structures at the centers. Field tasks included gathering historical and architectural information at each activity and at local and national repositories; and photographing, noting architectural features, and analyzing

each building's physical integrity. Each center's report included a history, an architectural description, and an evaluation of National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) eligibility. The Section 110 survey resulted in the recordation of more than 400 heritage assets and fifty-five buildings and structures, and the recommendation that one building was eligible for the NRHP. This project is relevant to the proposal as it demonstrates HHM's ability to provide architectural and historical information for a geographically-dispersed area.
