HHM undertook an extensive nationwide survey which updated and reassessed the cultural resources (buildings) previously surveyed by HHM during the mid-1990s. The project included a survey of heritage assets (historic objects) to determine the number and classification of historic objects at each Naval Reserve facility and to determine if any of the objects qualify as Navy National Treasures or are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.

Field tasks included gathering historical and architectural information; and photographing, noting the significant architectural features, and analyzing the physical integrity of each

extant resource. HHM performed an inventory of heritage assets at each center and photo-documented the objects. The final reports included historic backgrounds of the buildings and their relationship to the history of the Naval Reserve Forces, and the inventory lists of all heritage assets found at the locations. Survey results included the recordation of 2531 heritage assets and 345 buildings and structures. The naval reserve center in Cheyenne, Wyoming was included in the survey. This project is relevant to the proposal as it illustrates the firm's ability to provide comprehensive architectural and historical information for a large-scale federal project.
