HHM conducted, in 2003 and 2004, a comprehensive survey of all extant housing-related resources at the following locations: Naval Air Stations Pensacola, Key West, Jacksonville, Whiting Field, FL; Meridian, MS; Naval Support Activities Mid-South, TN; Panama City, FL; Naval Construction Battalion Center Gulfport, MS; Naval Stations Mayport, FL; Pascagoula, MS; Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay, GA; Naval

Weapons Station Charleston, SC. The proposed transfer of Navy family housing to private contractors triggered a cultural resources survey in compliance with Section 106. HHM field crews documented more than 4,000 structures for NRHP eligibility. In addition, HHM prepared a historic context for each installation using materials collected from national and local research repositories.
